## **Amendment to the Statutes for Admission to the Master's Program of Physics at Karlsruhe Institute of Technology (KIT)**

of November 20, 2025

Pursuant to Art. 10, par. 2, No. 5 and Art. 20, par. 2 of the Act on Karlsruhe Institute of Technology (KIT Act) of July 14, 2009 (Bulletin, pp. 317), last amended by Art. 2 of the 5<sup>th</sup> Act on the Amendment to University Regulations (5. Hochschulrechtsänderungsgesetz) of November 12, 2024 (Bulletin 2024, No. 97, pp. 47) and Art. 58, par. 1, cl. 2 and Art. 63, par. 2 of the Act of Baden-Württemberg on Universities and Colleges (Landeshochschulgesetz) of January 01, 2005 (Bulletin, pp. 1), last amended by Art. 1 of the 5<sup>th</sup> Act on the Amendment to University Regulations of November 12, 2024 (Bulletin 2024, No. 97, pp. 1), the KIT Senate on November 17, 2025 adopted the following statutes:

### **Article 1: Amendment to the Statutes for Admission to the Master's Program of Physics at KIT**

The Statutes for Admission to the Master's Program of Physics at Karlsruhe Institute of Technology (KIT) of February 27, 2023 (Official Announcements of KIT, p. 36, No. 13) are amended as follows:

In Article 5, par. 1, No. 2, the following clauses 4 to 6 are inserted after clause 3:

“If not more than 10 ECTS credits are lacking in the areas listed under a) to c), the applicant, in addition to or by derogation from clause 3, may still be admitted subject to the supplementary requirement of having to successfully pass the lacking coursework in addition to the valid studies plan. The corresponding proofs must be provided at the end of the second semester at the latest. Any supplementary requirement will be made by the Admission Committee and notified to the applicant together with the decision on admission; the Studies and Examination Regulations for the Bachelor's Program of Physics apply to the passing of examinations in the supplementary subjects; a second repetition of ultimately failed examinations in the supplementary subjects is not permitted.”

### **Article 2: Entry into Force**

The present amendment enters into force on the day after its publication in the official announcements of KIT. It will apply to the application procedure for the 2026 summer semester for the first time.
